

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Transit Equity Day is a National Day of Action to promote equity in public transportation. It is celebrated on February 4, Rosa Parks' birthday.

Rosa Parks was born on February 4, 1913 and was a civil rights icon and activist. She refused when instructed to move to the back of a Montgomery, Alabama, city bus in 1955. While she was not the first to resist bus segregation, her defiance became an important symbol for the Civil Rights movement.

Equity is at the heart of the IndyGo Foundation's mission. We believe access to transportation is as essential as access to electricity and clean water. Transit connects people to jobs, healthcare, education, and to each other.

Typical IndyGo Rider

- African American
 Woman
- Age 35-49
- She is employed but likely has a household income of less than \$25,000 per year.
- There is no vehicle available to her.
- She uses cash on the bus and walks less than 1/4 mile to and from the bus stop.



- · She only takes one bus to arrive at her destination
- She uses the bus 5 days a week to travel between home and work.



IndyGo By the Numbers











87% of IndyGo riders can be considered "frequent riders" and use IndyGo three or more times per week.

72% of IndyGo riders are **employed**, including **17%** that work **part-time**.

57% of IndyGo riders are from households that earn **less than \$25,000** annually.

94% of IndyGo riders walk to/from the bus stop.





9% of Marion County households and **57%** of IndyGo riders **do not have access to a vehicle** either by choice or circumstance.

55.3% of IndyGo riders are African American, **33%** are White, **5.8%** are Multiracial, **2.8%** are Latinx, **1.5%** are other, **1%** are Asian/Pacific Islander, and **.6%** are Native American.

It takes an average of **\$22,000** to make **one bus stop accessible** and would take **\$40M** to make **all** eligible IndyGo bus stops ADA accessible.








The Mobility Access Fund focuses on increasing access to public transportation. When we talk about access to the transit system, we are referring to:

PHYSICAL ACCESS – Riders need well-maintained ramps and sidewalks that create safe and secure connections to and from transit stops.

ECONOMIC ACCESS – Riders need to be able to afford to get to their destination, regardless of income level.




We increase access by supporting discounts for Veterans, seniors, students, and people with disabilities. We provide resources to nonprofit organizations. And we invest in infrastructure ensuring bus stops are ADA-accessible. By addressing access, IndyGo Foundation helps to meet not only the needs of the riders but the needs of our entire community.

We all collectively depend on fellow citizens getting to and from their jobs. IndyGo riders are healthcare personnel, teachers, grocery store clerks, and hospitality workers, to name a few of the essential public transit riders. Mobility is much more than just moving riders. It's about getting riders to their hopes and dreams, to their education and careers, to their families and friends, to their health and well-being, and to another day of life in Indianapolis and the surrounding areas.

Every day, at least 30,000 people navigate Indianapolis without access to a vehicle. There is no other organization in Indianapolis dedicated to increasing access to public transportation. Join us today.

Bus Rapid Transit

- Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) is a high-quality, high-capacity service with fast, frequent, and reliable transportation to access jobs, food, education etc.
- The Red Line opened in 2019. The Purple Line is under construction, opening in 2024. The Blue Line is in the design phase.
- The Red and Purple BRT lines represent 52.2 miles of infrastructure improvements on some of the busiest corridors in Indianapolis.
- With 25.8 miles of sidewalk included in the projects, BRT improves pedestrian safety and accessibility on a large scale.
- The IndyGo Foundation has developed a comprehensive package for the Red and Purple lines naming sponsorship that includes 715 million annual impressions.
- Each of the 45 stations on the lines is available for sponsorship with an average of 8 million annual impressions. Sponsorships are \$50,000 per station.



Free Fare Days

IndyGo has been fare-free, system-wide, on select holidays for many years. Starting in 2022, the IndyGo Foundation began to seek sponsors for these free days and identify new days to bring attention to transit equity.

- Election Day Sponsored by AARP of Indiana


Sponsorship of a Free-Fare Day starts at \$25,000 and provides:

- Proceeds to support The Mobility Access Fund

- Opportunity to issue a joint press release between your company, IndyGo, and the Foundation.
